To explore and address pressing workforce challenges ONL assembled a Think Tank made up of regional experts. At the Fall Quarterly Meeting, Think Tank experts will share best practices, short- and long-term strategies for addressing staffing shortfalls, lessons learned, and ideas for collaboration to promote long-term investments in the nursing and health care workforce.

Nurses comprise the largest sector of the health care workforce and are present in almost every care delivery setting. After enduring 18 months of the COVID-19 pandemic, there is no question about the tremendous value nurses add in caring for patients and communities.

The nursing profession has endured shortages in the past, however, COVID-19 is proving to be a disruptor like no other, causing workforce instability, locally and nationally. Unlike previous shortages, health care organizations are facing unprecedented competition for travel nurses, increased patient acuity and volume, a fatigued workforce, more leaves of absences than predicted, earlier clinical nurse retirements, among other complex factors. Navigating this instability will take innovation, creativity, flexibility and persistence.

On September 10th, regional leaders will share ideas for collecting and analyzing data, improving nurse retention, new nurse onboarding, and other strategies to stabilize the nursing workforce in organizations.
