Increasing Influence for Leaders in Nursing

Harry Truman once famously complained, “I sit here all day trying to persuade people to do the things they ought to have the sense to do without my persuading them. That’s all the powers of the President amount to.” If even the most powerful people in the world have a hard time influencing others, where does that leave the rest of us? As nurse leaders, you don’t have authority over most of the people you need to influence—like the patients, their families, and doctors. However, you can increase your influence with your employees and others, by learning how influence works.

Dr. Zoe Chance is an Assistant Professor of Marketing at Yale School of Management, where she researches and teaches the science of influence. She will present science and strategies for optimal influence in two interactive sessions on December 14th. In the morning, you’ll discover which force of influence is more powerful than motivation, and you’ll learn the “magic question” that you can ask to shift listeners from resistance to problem-solving. You’ll learn how to apply influence techniques to real-life situations. The afternoon will focus on practical skills that will cause others to listen to you when you’re speaking in a group. Whether it’s a formal presentation, staff meeting, or an informal conversation during patient rounds, you can increase your influence by making small yet powerful changes to your verbal and body language.
